### *What are the Benefits of Being an Arizona CEP Participant?*

#### **SCHOLARSHIP AND GRAND CANYON STATE UNIVERSITY AWARD**

High school students graduating from a CEP participant high school, who are fully admissible to GCU (not accepted with specifications), will receive a minimum institutional scholarship package of \$3,750 per academic year. The total GCU scholarship package could be higher based upon a student's level of academic merit, program of study, registration date and other offers for incoming students including those related to participation in athletics, pep band, theater, debate, etc. In addition, high school students graduating from a CEP participant high school will receive a \$1,000 Grand Canyon State University award per year at GCU. The amount is broken into \$500 for each fall and spring semester.

**DEGREE SCHOLARSHIP FOR STAFF** Exclusive **10% scholarship** for CEP faculty, staff and governing board members\* on tuition for undergraduate, graduate or doctoral degree programs at GCU.

#### **CONTINUING EDUCATION/SINGLE COURSE SCHOLARSHIP**

CEP participants will have access to a **10% scholarship** for their faculty, staff and governing board members\*, providing savings for non-degree single courses and continuing teacher education courses.

**SCHOLARSHIP FOR SPOUSES** Exclusive **5% scholarship** for spouses of CEP participant faculty, staff and governing board members\*, providing savings toward tuition and fees for online undergraduate, graduate or doctoral degree programs at GCU.

**SCHOLARSHIP FOR PARENTS** Exclusive **5% scholarship** for CEP parents on tuition for undergraduate or graduate degree programs through the GCU College of Education or a doctoral degree related to the field of education.

**COHORTS** CEP participants may request that cohorts be developed for continuing education and/or degree programs on GCU's campus, online or at an approved CEP site or regionally approved GCU site.

**DUAL ENROLLMENT** CEP participant schools will have access to dual enrollment courses for their high school students, offering them an opportunity to reduce the time to complete a bachelor's degree from four years to three. **This could reduce college costs by up to 25%.**

**AWARD OPPORTUNITIES** CEP participants will be invited to apply for Strategic Educational Alliances award opportunities, if available.

**TODAYSLEARN** CEP participant schools will have access to GCU's Today'sLearn services. Available Today'sLearn opportunities include: Speakers Bureau (motivational speaking and lectures), Professional Development (instruction based on specific subject matter and customized to address specific needs) and Coaching, Mentoring and Consultation (individualized assistance in areas requested).

**LOPES LEAP TO TEACH** CEP participants will be invited to recruiting events on campus to meet GCU College of Education students.

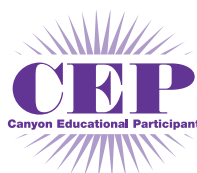
**ONLINE JOB BOARD** CEP participants have access to the GCU Online Job Board to post employment opportunities and search for applicants.

**EVENT DISCOUNTS** CEP participants receive priority communication about events on GCU's campus. CEP faculty, staff and families will receive discounts for GCU academic and athletic camps along with other events sponsored by Strategic Educational Alliances.

**GCU FACILITIES** CEP participants will have access to GCU for facility usage, subject to availability, at a participant rate. A quote will be provided for any additional requests.

GCU institutional scholarships are allowed to be combined up to the following limits: Chancellor/ President Scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$16,500, all other scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$14,000, all scholarship recipients living off campus – up to \$11,500. micro-scholarships, may not be combined with any other form of GCU-funded institutional aid or scholarships, micro-scholarships may replace GCU institutional aid not to exceed \$6,000 per academic year.
